Who we Are

- 2006 Created by the Province of BC to support economic development in the Southern Interior
- April 2021 Re-Launched as ETSI-BC, the Economic Trust of the Southern Interior
- Regional Advisory Committees:
 Local elected officials from Thompson-Okanagan & Columbia-Kootenay regions
- Board: 8 elected officials, 5 provincial appointees



Who we Serve

Population of ~758,000, includes:

- 9 Regional Districts
- 53 Municipalities
- 33 First Nations
 - 27 in the TO-RAC area
 - 6 in the CK-RAC area











Some Highlights



- +\$4.6 million in grant funding to 165 projects since April 2021
- Total funding of \$71 million since inception on 551 projects worth \$256 million
- These projects helped create or maintain 14,000+ jobs in our region (10,000+ jobs since 2021)

- Enhance the capacity of small/rural/First
 Nations communities to fulfill their ED
 aspirations and goals
- Support local and regional economic development projects
- Facilitate strategic partnerships and encourage regional collaboration between communities

Project Types: Small-Scale

Purpose: economic development capacity for research and planning

- For communities with pop <25,000
- Max grant \$15,000
- Projects in communities with < 5,000 residents are eligible for 100% funding
- Projects in communities with 5,000-25,000 residents may receive 50% funding



Examples of Small-Scale Projects

- Economic development planning/research (i.e., community branding, strategic plans, revitalization plans, broadband assessments)
- Business retention/attraction strategies
 (i.e., business walks, community engagement)
- Business diversification
 (i.e., supply chain analysis)
- Industry/workforce engagement
 (i.e., workforce analysis, attraction strategy)



Project Types: Large Scale



Development

Capacity

Purpose: To assess, initiate or implement economic development projects

- Max grant \$50,000
- Applicants may receive up to 50% funding of project budget
- Applicants must have a financial contribution to the project





Examples of Large-Scale Projects

- Business Diversification
 (i.e., capital investment analysis; business attraction
 campaign; labour force attraction campaign)
- Sector Development
 (i.e., co-working space, food hub, supply chain
 development, tourism development)
- Community Revitalization (i.e., shop local campaign, downtown beautification program, improve a community-use facility)



Project Types: Collaborative/Regional

Purpose: To assess, initiate or implement an economic development project with regional impact

- Max grant \$50,000
- Priority given to collaborative projects with First Nations and local/regional government
- Applicants may receive up to 60% funding of project budget
- Collaborative partners much each contribute financially to the project



Collaborative/Regional Project Examples

- business diversification
- industry sector development
- community revitalization

Must have a **regional focus** and impact (i.e., major capital investment analysis, regional business attraction initiative)



Project Focus



- Encourage initiatives in support of innovation at <u>regional or sector level</u>
- Improve competitiveness by supporting sector-based initiatives, collaboration and partnerships
- Support industry to improve environmental sustainability and transition to a Net Zero economy
- Support initiatives that which focus on reducing environmental impacts of businesses



Who Can Apply?



- Economic Development organizations
- Non-profit business support organizations
- Social Enterprises
- Industry Associations
- Co-operative Groups
- Business Accelerators



Funding Terms



- Maximum grant \$50,000
- Applicants may receive up to 75% funding of the total project budget
- Applicants must financially contribute the remaining 25% of the project budget – inkind contribution cannot exceed 10% of project budget
- Priority given to projects with higher leveraging



Project Examples

- Target industry workforce attraction
- Tourism strategic plan
- Industry recycling feasibility
- Cleantech study
- Outdoor gear industry association supply chain study to on-shore manufacturing
- Logging industry member support
- Regional agriculture initiatives



Application Tip 1: Prepare

Do Your Homework!

- Read the **Application Guide**
- Review the <u>Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)</u>
 on our website
- Review the <u>list of funded projects</u> from last year on our website
- Look at the <u>Stories</u> page of our website for inspiration & ideas

Don't start an application before talking to us.



Application Tip 2: Rationale

- Have a clear project rationale –why is your project important?
- Reference prior work, data or studies to support your rationale
- What are the expected economic outcomes?
- Letters of support not a template
- Need support from the economic development entity in your community, if that is not you





Application Tip 3: Metrics & Money

- Employ clear, measurable economic metrics how do you know the project is successful?
- Identify the number of jobs created and/or maintained by your project
- Leverage from other funders
- Include quotes from contractors/consultants
- Budget round numbers (not \$20,498)






Application Tip 4: Project Type/Scope

- Your project may seem to fit in several project types. If not sure, ask which application you should complete
- Ensure that the project builds capacity does more than your usual business activities
- No shotgun approach only submit one application per organization
- Consider whether you can do the project with less funding. If you receive less, what can still be done?

Funding Decisions

- 1. Evaluation/scoring criteria set by ETSI-BC Board
- 2. Due diligence by ETSI-BC Grant Team
- 3. Review and recommendation by ETSI-BC Regional Advisory Committees
- 4. Approval/conditional approval by CEO

* Available funding ~\$375,000



Application/Decision Timelines

April 1, 2023 Spring Funding Intake opens

May 1, 2023 @ 4 pm Funding Intake closes

May 2 – 31 Due Diligence/ applicant follow up

June 16 RAC review

June 26 – 30 Applicants advised/contribution

agreements signed

% funding disbursed upon signing
