- Created in 2006 by the Province of BC to support economic development in the Southern Interior
- April 2021 Re-Launched as ETSI-BC, the Economic
   Trust of the Southern Interior
- Regional Advisory Committees:
   Local elected officials from Thompson-Okanagan &
   Columbia-Kootenay regions
- Board: 8 elected officials, 5 provincial appointees






# Some Highlights



- \$4.6+ million in grant funding to 165 projects since April 2021
- Total funding of \$71 million since inception on 551 projects worth \$256 million
- These projects helped create or maintain 14K+ jobs in our region (10K+ jobs since 2021)

# Funding by Pillar since April 2021




#### Notes:

# FIR Program Details

# Purpose of the FIR Program

The Province of BC developed this program to help businesses and communities that have experienced:

- Significant forest sector curtailments since 2019
- Recent mill closures or layoffs, and/or
- Declining fibre supply due to
  - a recent or planned old growth logging deferral
  - Significant wildfire season
  - Pine beetle infestation, and/or
  - Cariboo habitat protection





#### FIR Program Overview



- ETSI-BC has \$1.35 Million available to support rural communities impacted by mill closures, old growth deferrals and reduction in timber supply
- Funding to support hiring of Community and/or Business advisors in impacted communities
- Investment from Province of BC's Rural Business and Community Recovery Initiative
- Program duration our agreements will conclude by December 1, 2024.



### FIR Program Objectives



- Support communities and businesses to mitigate the impact of changes to the forest sector and secondary industries
- Enhance rural communities capacity to support impacted businesses
- Leverage existing community and business support organizations
- Support rural communities to create economic recovery plans and diversify their economies



# **Project Funding**

- Priority for eligible impacted communities with <25,000 population</li>
- Max grant \$75,000
- Eligible communities may receive 100% funding (i.e. no leveraging required)
- Funding is for the creation of a Forest Impact Recovery Advisor for the community and/or local businesses

#### Eligible Projects will focus on:

- Community Economic Recovery and Diversification (Ec. Dev planning, community consultation & engagement, diversification strategies)
- 2. Business Advisory Services
  (business needs, market diversification, financial analysis, identify specialized professional services)
- 3. Combination of 1 & 2



# Who Can Apply?



- Local governments & First Nations
- Economic development organizations
- Non-profit business support organizations
- Industry Associations / Business Accelerators

\*Applicants must be located in the ETSI-BC service area AND be serving forest dependent impacted community



### Application Tip 1: Prepare

- Read the <u>Application Guide</u>
- Review the <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u>
   (FAQs) on our website
- Confirm your community's eligibility
- If not sure about something, reach out!



Don't start an application before talking to us.



### Application Tip 2: Rationale

- What are the circumstances that make you an eligible community?
- How will the position support businesses in communities impacted by the downturn in the forestry sector?
- Why are you qualified to do the project?
- Does this build on previous work, economic data or studies?
- Letters of support



### Application Tip 3: Metrics & Money



- Demonstrate your community's eligibility and identify the forest sector impacts being addressed
- Employ clear, measurable economic metrics - how do you know the project is successful?
- Identify the number of jobs created and/or maintained by your project
- Leverage other funding (not required but can show community commitment)
- Partner with neighbouring communities and/or service providers

# Application/Funding Decision Timelines



March 15, 2023 FIR Funding Intake opens

April 15 Funding Intake closes (4 pm)

April 15 – 30 Due Diligence/ applicant follow up


May 15 Funding announcement

May 16 – 30 Applicants advised/contribution
