




POPULATION

The estimated population of Central Okanagan in July, 2022, is 235,472. It increased by 2.8% from the year before (based on Statistics Canada Annual Population Estimates).

Between the two most recent census years (2021 and 2016), the population increased by 14.0% (from 194,892 to 222,162). Population density is 76.5 inhabitants per square kilometer.



Census- Kelowna CMA 2006-2021 Population












Growth of Businesses by Employee Size (2017 to 2022)


